#### We Have the Answers to World Peace




# We Have the Answers to World Peace (continued from page 1)



### **Home Sweet Home for Client and Baby**



SB was referred to us last April from a former successful client who had lived in one of our mobile homes and finally graduated out. SB is a pregnant late-twenties lady who had been "couch surfing" and working with Birthright during her unplanned pregnancy. We found out she works in a permanent job at a local grocery store, earning good wages and getting health care benefits. What she really needed was a place to call her own, so she could prepare for the baby girl who is to be born in early fall. Her situation became known to us just when we had an open unit, and it was a delight getting her moved in and helping her get furniture for her new home.

We found out her automobile situation wasn't good either, as her car had major repair issues. It ended up that she was aware of an excellent used car she could acquire if we could help some, so FSBH purchased it for her and now she can easily get

back and forth to work. The car she found was in Little Rock, AR, and her dad drove her there to get it.

Then thanks to Covid, her hours were cut back recently, and covering her July lot rent was difficult. FSBH was able to pay that expense. Now we pray she doesn't have any more financial problems. This is a good example of what we try to do for our mobile home clients, to help them succeed in permanent housing and remain self-supporting there as long as they can afford it. We can only do this because of our faithful and generous donors. If we don't have funds, we can't help.

We don't know how long SB and her baby girl will be "under our roof," so to speak, but it is a joy to have a grateful and thankful client who is experiencing the love of **Jesus** in practical ways.

#### **Women Prisoners Need Pen Pals**

As you probably know, **Broken & Beautiful** (B&B) is a Christ-focused prison ministry that has served the **Women's Eastern Reception**, **Diagnostic and Correctional Center** (WERDCC) in Vandalia since 2014. We have held weekly Thursday Night Services as well as quarterly Church services and hosted bi-annual weekend seminars at this facility over the years. Since the pan-

demic hit in March, the facility has been closed to all volunteers as well as visitors. However, the need these women have to look for direction and healing through their relationship with Christ has not changed.

With all of the Christian ministries shut out of the facility and the need still real, **Broken & Beautiful** decided to step up our **Pen2Pen Pen Pal** program. With our limitations to directly interact with the inmates at WERDCC we worked with the prison Chaplain to hand out flyers and promote this program. We used the prison email system for signups and to connect the volunteers to the inmates. The result is that we have 100 women who have signed up for the Pen2Pen program and have increased our volunteers from 8 to 21. God is at work in Vandalia!

At this time, we are still needing more Christian women to act as pen pal sponsors. The feedback from our sponsors and the impact this program is having is incredible. Through our pen pal sponsors we are continuing to assist the ladies once they leave prison, which is when the challenges really intensify. Once you become Christ's hands and feet to those who are in need, your life is more blessed than those you are serving.

We are grateful for the groups that have been able to serve since we restarted meals in June. We welcome a new server, Laurie Guffey from Faith Christian Family Church, who has started serving on 3rd Mondays.

Because of concerns about Covid-19, many groups are unable to return to serving at this time, so we have a number of openings on the schedule. ### **Grocery Angel Feeds the Homeless and Poor**



In the midst of the COVID-19 Crisis, one community need in the Wentzville area did not suffer much, thanks to the willing volunteerism of one lady who helped once... twice ... and now more than 30

Mrs. Pam Russina, Dardenne Prairie, aka "Grocery Angel" had been one of the providers of hot meals at the Economy Inn, Wentzville, through the First Step Back Home (FSBH) homeless ministry as a part of her church group from Grace Community Chapel, St. Peters. When she heard that meals needed to be suspended due to healthcare concerns, she decided to form a new ministry and rally her friends to take bagged-up grocery items to the parking lots of two motels where the homeless and economically disadvantaged stayed. She identified needy folks- those who had lost their jobs due to Covid-19, and clients of FSBH; and masked and gloved, the Grocery Angel brought them food two-three times each week, shared a little encouragement, prayed with some and

thereby fed their bodies and souls. She's been doing this since mid-March and has continued even after the FSBH evening meals program restarted, since there have been many open nights on the schedule due to continued Covid 19 concerns on the part of meal provider groups. About 150 meals per week had been provided by our Grocery Angel, or about 1,650 meals from mid-March through the end of May!

Pam put the word out through her social media contacts and found many who were eager to help with her cause. Some contributed financially, so she could buy items according to menus she prepared. Others surprised her and just dropped off LOTS of grocery items at her doorstep. Since the start of her effort she has collected more than \$5,395, served 1323 meals, and had about 200 volunteers shopping, prepping, delivering, donating and praying!

Weekly, Pam has been reporting in her Wentzville Meals Ministry Facebook group about her interactions with those she's taken groceries to. She's been able to help get many connected to job resources or other agencies who could help with long-term solutions, provide incidental personal care items and just share God's love with those who have been discouraged by their situations.




















# **Services Provided by FSBH through** St. Charles, Lincoln & Warren Continuum of Care



#### Do You Know Someone In Danger of Homelessness?



The Coordinated Entry program, through the Continuum of Care for St. Charles, Lincoln & Warren Counties, can

Have them call 2-1-1. Enter "2," then their zip code. Enter "3" if for currently homeless, and they'll be connected to a coordinated entry staff person. (If someone enters "1," that's for utility support; or "2," that's for food or transportation support.) FSBH will then get a referral if our agency is the best source of help for the client.
