WHAT'S THE PROBLEM?

The downfall of America is due to rejecting God and His Son Jesus! (2 Chronicles 7:14)

- 39.7 million in US live in poverty. That is a rate of 12.3 percent, or 1 in 7 living in poverty.
- 36 million are on food stamps in our nation.
- 28% of Missourians on welfare and SSD receiving below poverty level income.
- Over 50% of the workers in Missouri are not earning a living wage.
- A living wage in Missouri is \$18/hr., \$720 per week or \$37,440 per year. Millions of unskilled employees are making only \$10.00/hr.

Wonder why we have so many poor and homeless? **Low paying jobs and indifference.**

WHAT CAN WE DO?

“We know what real love is because Jesus Christ gave up his life for us, and so we ought to give up our lives for our Christian brothers and sisters. VISION

1. To **increase awareness** of the needs of the poor within our community.
2. To **promote unity** in the community by encouraging people to get involved in the lives of the poor - needy in practical ways.
3. To **reduce suffering and misery** of the poor by showing the Love of God in sacrifice and risk from something of ourselves.

First Step = Self-supporting in transitional housing such as motels, rooms for rent or shared housing, and first steps to salvation.

Self-Supporting = Earning sufficient income to provide the basics of life for self or family.

HOW THE PROGRAM WORKS

Shelter

- Get homeless off the streets providing temporary lodging in local motels
- Support fragile families in their own homes with rent or utility assistance and more
- Transition successful clients to mobile homes

Employment

- Temporary Labor Agencies
- Require active job search by client (15 apps) for each night of lodging
- Provision of cell phones for job search

Food

- Food pantry list lists 30 sites in region
- Survival food boxes available if pantries are closed
- Provision of daily hot meals at local motel by ministry volunteer groups and churches

Clothing

- Local thrift shop vouchers
- Survival backpacks with toiletries - underwear

Transportation

- Purchase vehicles for clients when able
- Bicycles provided when available.
- Auto maintenance, fuel, repairs assistance
- Rides from FSBH volunteers, family/friends
