

This group of 8-year-olds organized a sandwich making project and brought tasty food to the Economy Inn as part of our daily meals program. She said it was a huge life lesson for the kids. We expect to see more of both of these groups of caring young people in the coming days!

A total of 120 fragile families had pre-registered for this popular local event, and that represented 252 children, 67 teens and 250 adults. There were 60% new families this year.

About 40 volunteers were on hand to assure that all went smoothly during the drive-through event where families picked up filled laundry baskets, Bibles, diapers, snack food, toys, handmade gifts and quilts. Each family was also provided a \$25 Walmart gift card, thanks to the generosity of FSBH donors.










Emergency Weather Response Update



Many will say that this past winter season has been rather mild. But for those unhoused neighbors needing a shelter on some of the bitter cold nights, even one instance could have brought life-changing consequences. For the 2022-2023 season, there have been 15 activations of the **Emergency Weather** Response (EWR) team, as of the first of March. These have been held at seven different locations, primarily churches, and 164 data intakes have been done for 76 households. A total of 181 bed nights of lodging have been provided. All of this year's activities have been organized by volunteers in the three-

county region of St. Charles, Warren and Lincoln Counties.

Activation occurs when temps are predicted to be 20 degrees or lower. Keep the hotline number handy, as it will always relate current information on activations for those needing a warm place to stay on bitter cold winter nights. **636-395-0492**








Client Services Overview: 2022














Tom Lowery Memorial Donations

Cuivre River Operation Round Up Funds Pay for Motel Stays

Once again, the **Cuivre River Electric Cooperative's (CREC) Operation Round Up (ORU) Trust** has funded **FSBH** with money for emergent lodging at local motels this year. In February we received \$3,000 which will provide about 40 nights of stays at one of the several motels used by our ministry to help our unhoused neighbors when they call daily for help.

Tim Schmidt, ORU Coordinator, told us that 16 different organizations asked for \$64,000, but only \$18,000 was available to be supplied. Over the past 18 years, **FSBH** has benefitted from being selected for these special funds with the provision of \$126,000! We are so thankful for support such as this, where many customers of the CREC utility service "round up" their monthly bills to the next dollar, providing the "cents" that build to the amounts that are able to bless many different charities and needy families.
